



After hectic preparations lasting 4 days with Miss Joanna preparing set off at 3.30. having done Clevedon o.p. in morning, with a full load including Miss Joanna.

W. Raining. Wotton. Bibury. Tea at Whitney. Oxford. London. via 56 Tedworth Circus, Crossways Sq. & St. Thomas to park on embankment. Stuard Courner House basement grill. "Chicken in Basket". 8.30pm. Chicken. Steak & White Wine. Alison had fish & chips. Micky said he could stay there eating forever! Colin collected Miss Joanna. Us to Oupington, where we found Bob in Paris & house in possession of a Dragon & her Son. - 'Universal Aunt.' Cold milk, so to bed.

25. 8. 60.

T. Early rise. Promise of sunshine unfulfilled. lovely dahlias. High wind. Off at 8.30 am. Unusually drive except for bypass at Maidstone. Further purchases at Dover. Highly organised drive into ferry. 'Lord Warden'. Rapid windy crossing. leaving 12 women - arriving 1.20 pm. Lunch on board - followed by orange juice in bar. Micky said he was seasick. Quite cold & dull.

Equally rapid disembarkation at Boulogne. On the road by 2 pm. We liked Sames with its old church. & Montueuil with hill situation, ramparts & some lovely old wine. Unessential drive until just before Forest - Montiers where the fan belt broke. Fortunately had a spare which a garage fixed quickly. <sup>Shopped in.</sup> Abbeville. Rouen. Sun came out - lovely view down river. Road rose up onto hills on S. Bank of Seine. Glorious views of the river with ocean going ships sailing down it. Picnic evening meal on side road overlooking the ferry & wide through the forest. Sausages, bacon & local wine. Made up beds - put kids to sleep & drove on through dark to Honfleur. Very pleased with first view of harbor with floodlit church & old. lieutenant's house. Considered hiring a pension but had camp.



so early & it was so good that we all piled into the van & slept - rather fitfully because of mosquitoes. till 7 am.


26. 8. 60 F.

S. 27. 8. 60. Cleaning skies. breakfast & on the road via Pegasus bridge captured by 5th.  
Parachute brigade 6. 6. 1944. D. Day. to Caen. - almost entirely newly rebuilt except for  
2 abbeys des Femmes, & des Hommes. Fine examples of Norman architecture but  
rather extensively restored. & a bit disappointing. Weddings all over the place. Walk to  
Church of St. Nicholas. - shopping & more shopping on outskirts. then glorious drive  
through deserted hinterland of Normandy - wooded rolling hill sides. to Villers Bocage.  
entirely destroyed & rebuilt, after which picnic lunch. pâté, saucisson, cheese etc. →  
Pontfarcy in Vallée de l'Avre to copper beating town of Villieu-les-Poëles. lovely old church (15

Dull & rain squalls. Petrol last view of the Mont. S. Michel  
then through rather dull scenery to ~~St.~~ Dol. Sun coming  
out. Cathedral, with 2 fine porches decorated in low relief.  
wooden Christ & oriel window. Cider, crepe (plain cold)  
in a small cake. Walk onto ramparts of town  
with fine view over Mont Dol.

Rather uninteresting drive through to Dinan.  
Approach by viaduct over the Rance with a view  
down onto the old port & river. Parked in Cathedral square.  
Romanesque doorway.  
Walk from English garden, ramparts, outside old chateau into  
old town: clock tower, old streets. & finally as sun  
came out sat down to lunch at 350 F each at  
Vol au vent, ham rolls, tomatoe, biksteak, salad,  
potatoe, cheese & <sup>mayonnaise</sup> fruit. local wine - Muscadet.  
Walk back through town & so to Lamballe, home of the

Picnic lunch on beach. - Pate de Pays. - grapes. Stayed on beach all the afternoon. - occasional squally showers.

Bought some Boules. Jilly burst the ball.

Unsuccessful badminton. Saw a sailing dinghy capsize. Wished to a play on the <sup>Deaths head</sup> <sup>& Pile of Pencils</sup> ~~wireless~~. Walk & climb over the rocks. Saw crepes being made. Back to dinner. Tom de force by Jill. Steak. Peas Potatoes. Melon. Red wine - bed.

T. 30. 8. 60. Again dull early cleared up soon to brilliant windy morning. Van to St. Cuzco, then walk over cliffs to St. Cuzco port from the plage. Saw Statue to St Cuzco with pinkles in nose from local habit of young girls to ensure marriage, banded here in cloth. I van to sheltered bay between Ploumanac & Thegastel. Had a swim. Picnic lunch of soup & pate in the van. Sunbathed, read, diary knitted & game of boules. Back to camp gave children supper & put to bed in the van

then dined up & went to Penros Cuisine for special meal. Decided on Sphinx hotel high up on cliffs overlooking the sea. Homard à l'Américaine. - hot lobster dish in delicious sauce & with rice, with Muscadet wine. cost. £2 each. - took 2 hours & was worth it - couldn't really finish it. last way in Penros Cuisine & so back to bed. Jill left sick.

Wt. 30.8.60.

Sunshine. left the camp Fandien reluctantly. Pleasant drive along Corniche de L'Annonique. We liked Trebuarden, hamion - on a river like Quimper. Old houses, what we saw at the coast at St. Michel to St. Etienne was deserted sheltered, a good beach. Camping at St. Etienne. Morlaix had a huge viaduct, all the shops were shut. First of the Parish Churches was St. Thegonec. Triumphal Arch, Ossuary Calvary with St. Thegonec & the wolf. Wooden carving of holy sepulchre in crypt of ossuary - remarkable Mary Magdalen (see p.c.). Magnificent pulpit in wood with a painted canopy. St. Mary high up on the wall opposite framed in a tree of Jesse. Beautiful rosary retable. Church on hillside shortly after this, on a side road. Then to Guimilien. Huge Calvary magnificent baptistery <sup>(see p.c.)</sup> Stony at Catell-Colet on the Calvary. Fine S. Porch & beautiful retable. People ringing bells in ossuary. Then to hampan Guimilien. Tubet in wood across the church. Simple calvary  
calvary on one side 12 symbols on other side, old pieta, 7 figures carved in one piece of wood.

Another fine wooden group there. On to Sizun to see best triumphal arch  
of the lot. Did some shopping. Grand drive over the suspension bridge at  
Terenez. into sunshine (almost the best today) over the Aulme ~~then~~ after going  
through Le Faou - old houses, quiet town on river. Then to Crozon's Municipal  
Camp at Morgat. Poor sanitation, dirty earth small & overcrowded. Veal chops. Mushrooms.  
Pears. Fruit & red wine by Jill.

Tu. 9.60. Very hot day. packed up. Mournig on beach. got sunburnt. Alison got bitten by  
sandflies. English water skiing. lots of English at Grand Hotel. Shopping in  
Morgat with its port, grottoes & natural stone arch. Off to cap de la Cheune. heather  
gorse bees. Whitewashed Breton farms in a treeless landscape. 2 unknown German soldier  
graves - remains of German fortifications and magnificent views over the bay of  
Douarnenez - point de Dinan & point de Pen-Hir. Boats sardine & tunny fishing. Canoe of  
Boules - picnic lunch. Resume drive back through Morgat & Crozon to Anse de Dinan. a  
beautiful, deserted beach with rocks & caves to Camaret. Lobster port & boatbuilding preparing  
for its Pardon on the 8th. Sept. with a big fair. looked at Camping Municipal.  
Swings, roundabouts for the children - a newly built playground football stadium, housing  
estate & tree planted campsite, miniature golf. Visit to Menhirs - Lines of Lagatjan.  
- passed a ruined German battery defending Brest & a memorial to the Free French. & so to the






Pointe de Pen-Hir with the Tao de Pois. More fine seascapes. with views right to Brest.  
• the Pont Albert-houpe. Back to Carnaet walk along the quay to see ship building &  
the chapel of Notre Dame de Roch-Amadour. with ships hanging up inside. & so to find  
camp site. Saw some tents at Kerloch overlooking Anse de Dinan - looked like old abandoned  
summer camp site. - found a friendly farmer who gave us permission. & so pitched tent overlooking  
the deserted bay. Dinner. Spaghetti & hashed meat, garlic, onion. & tomatoe with red wine. delicious -  
walked over the beach to find shells, coves and a PORTUGUESE MEN OF WAR. see illustration. - Old German  
shells in a cave. & so to bed.



F. 2.9.60.

Drizzle + showers most of the morning drove into Camaret. shop gazed - Seahouses mounted in plastic, shell necklaces, expensive Breton pottery, wood work, fishing tackle. Visit to Live Shellfish Sheds to see lobster, crayfish + crab pens. Saw Sardine + Tunny + lobster boats. Cases of wine being taken on board. Weather depressing + so to lunch in Hotel - full of French families, on the Quay. Melon. Huge plate of langoustines - delicious. sausage boiled pork + potatoes. Fruit + cheeses - Gruyere, Tom Savoie. Petit Salut. / Muscadet

Very tired after lunch - sat + sketched picture overleaf. Jill + kids to swings + roundabouts. Weather cleared. lovely afternoon.  walked along the quay again. - back to campsite - walk across the bay. soup + cold pâté supper. + so to bed.


3.9.60. S.

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Raining quite heavily. Farmer came to sell us butter home made. £.360! per lb. beautifully made in a round decorated lump. Said good bye to him. Walk across bay to try to find Portuguese Men o' War, but all gone. Back for a swim as the sun had now come out + shining strongly. after. noon set out having packed up. Crozon where did shopping beach at Trez Belec. - deserted. - hot. Magnificent drive to Menez-Horn 1000 foot high hill overlooking practically all this part of Brittany. River Aulne. Brest. Douarnenez. etc. Down the hill to Chapel of St. Mary Menez Horn. Small Parish Close. Drive on to Chateaudin - unremarkable. and Locronon. Unspoilt village square with well, church, creperie and houses. Once a wealthy town making sailcloth. Sculptor in wood at work in village square. Magnificent reproduction of old statues. Church had notable Stained glass window. Tomb of St. Ronan in kersanton. (Breton granite). (15th good pulpit. Had ham, cheese, honey + jam crepes in an Oxford group recommended tea shop. - missed a lot. + so off to Douarnenez and Treboul. First Camp awful. Second camp municipal + marvellous. - almost as good as Ranton in a pinewood with rocks. Dinner on spaghetti + minced beef. Walk into Treboul.

Dull & raining. Off early to Benodet via Quimper to see Pardon Fair. - Sun came out. Old women in coifs. Took part in 2 raffles and won a cheap plate. Kids on the roundabout. Crossed the Ferry. Pont l'Abbe. Saw church and Begoulin monument. On to Locudy passing Chateau at Kerazan. Picnic lunch on the Quay side. Then to beach, & talked to Englishman. Round Circuit de Cornouaille via. le Cuzilines a lovely unspoilt sandstone port. Then playing Boules. Penmarc'h. - Plage d'Edenval. High wind - waves ++. On to St. Emele & saw wind on rocks, fishermen & boat putting out in high sea. Pleasant church at St. Nanna. Church with ships on it. Then to Audierne. & via. Port Croix & Combot back to Douarnenez. A nice sunny day & fascinating countryside. *Lead* cutlets & aubergines.

Fine morning. John had headache. Late start. Jill washed. Down to the Port  
by noon. I did a painting until 1.30. Jill shopped & kids to Plage des Dames.  
Started to rain at 1.30 pm. into van - panned. Picnic lunch on roadside before Locronan.  
At Locronan, visited Little Chapel, of M-D Bonne Nouvelle Wall & Calvary. Glanced into weaving shed.



Net provided - our rackets - still dry water like a pond. Dutch couple on beach. from Haarlem. Wonderful shells. Hermit crabs. Game of Bowles. Wrote diary, scrubbed beach. Turns on rocks. lunch. langoustines. & Fresh fried sardines. Telon - Muscadet. Back to the beach after lunch. More badminton. More people on the beach. Went for a walk round Beg Merl. Big houses at the rich retired & sea coast houses. at the wealthy expensive hotels full of English. Small harbour & view of Cooceanman. At cafe watched English waiting for papers. & had cheese & jam Crepes. beer & Lillet. Icecreams & lollipops. homey walk back to camp. Supper was an eat up meal of soup, pate, cheese etc.


F. 9. 9. 60.

fruit




Drive back through the dock. to camera, & so to bed.

Packed up. Saw the Dutch Couple. Camping cost. f. 320. !


Town of the Menhirs. houses of Menec. Children asking for English

past the Duke's Pool at the Forges of Parisport to Rennes. Like Paris with a  
magnificent view up the river with city on either side. Rapid visit to Palace de Justice  
& Tabor Gardens with General de Gaulle hot foot on our tails. - hordes of policemen.  
On through the setting sun to Vitre - its chateau, its old streets, antique shops.  
A long drive in the twilight & mists rising off the meadows this eve to Mayenne

deserted rolling countryside with Norman farmhouses. At Mayenne found a magnificent campsite by the river, swimming pool, canoes, etc. Dinner in his van. Oysters & Veal cutlets. & so to bed. very damp & misty - approached by drunk






