Dull morning becoming sunny, very hot. In to Bristol to collect Hoover dregs etc. Off at 11 am. - found we had the wrong queen card to pick up the night one and chicken for lunch. Traffic + r. Bath. Warminster. Stopped for lunch at Stapleford childrens playground and rubbish dump. Very hot. hate for boat so did not stop at Salisbury to see Mary Bailey (recent 26 wk. mise.) but left a bunch of our roses and a note from the Sylvestors instead. Wide road along edge of New Forest. No panies - No forest. Southampton docks. No big ships. No crowds. Not late. Superb service with a smile. (Stopped by cops looking for escaped convicts. ? Wilson. just before Southampton.) Beautiful ferry terminal, had tea. saw orange & queen. Thoresen car ferry arrive at 4 pm. On to boat which sailed at 4.30 pm. saw Chusan PRO & ? Union Castle liner. Down the Solent. Flying boat station. The needles & then high tea on ship. Hors d'Oeuvres. Braised Beef & chips. Coffe. Wine. (Could have had meal in restaurant at £1 a head. Passed the sister ship in mid channel. Viking I. Viking II our ship beautifully appointed. shops. bars. restaurant. cafeteria. Sat to do diary. Good sunset occasional shower. Entered Cherbourg with all lights on. bonthed near the Queen Mary with all lights on & floodlit funnels. Drove out of the bow of Viking II - lifted its nose at the smell of Cherbourg. Quickly through customs. Got lost as usual at exit to docks with everyone following us.

Drove out to Bartheur via St. Pierre les Eglises. Campsite at Bartheur overlooking the
harbour. rather crowded simple + not v. propre. to bed by 11 pm.

FRIDAY. 28.8.66.

Promise of a lovely day. camp cost 4.50^{fr.} lovely coastal drive down to St.
Vaast-la-Houque which we liked. Sailing dinghies. Simple harbour. Along invasion beach
Utah. Stopped at pillbox + played + ~~bathed~~ paddled. Stopped at French + American
memorials. American museum. - Along the road to S. Mame. Eglise. Huge noteworthy
church at St. Marie le Mont. Stopped at Carentan to buy wine + fruit + sundries.
On to St. Pol. - ramparts. into undulating wooded + agricultural country. Stopped
up a side road over a bridge + stream for lunch. - Remains of chicken, scotch egg,
Charente melon. Jouvray wine. On to Villedieu-les-Poeltes. Stopped for a visit to
modern stained glass in the church. + to buy a copper cauldron. some small pans for Alison
+ a pipe for Michael. - via Avranches to Mont. S Michel - parked + talked to
attendant about the Boates - climbed Mt. which was v. crowded + tripping + then
to Cancale. - couldn't find the recommended campsite - ? closed. Spurned
camping on the Point du Crouin + also a sleazy site - the Marisac. + found
a magnificent site at Gumiaves - beaches rocks. cliffs. lagoons. Soup.
Steak + Baked beans.

to jar.

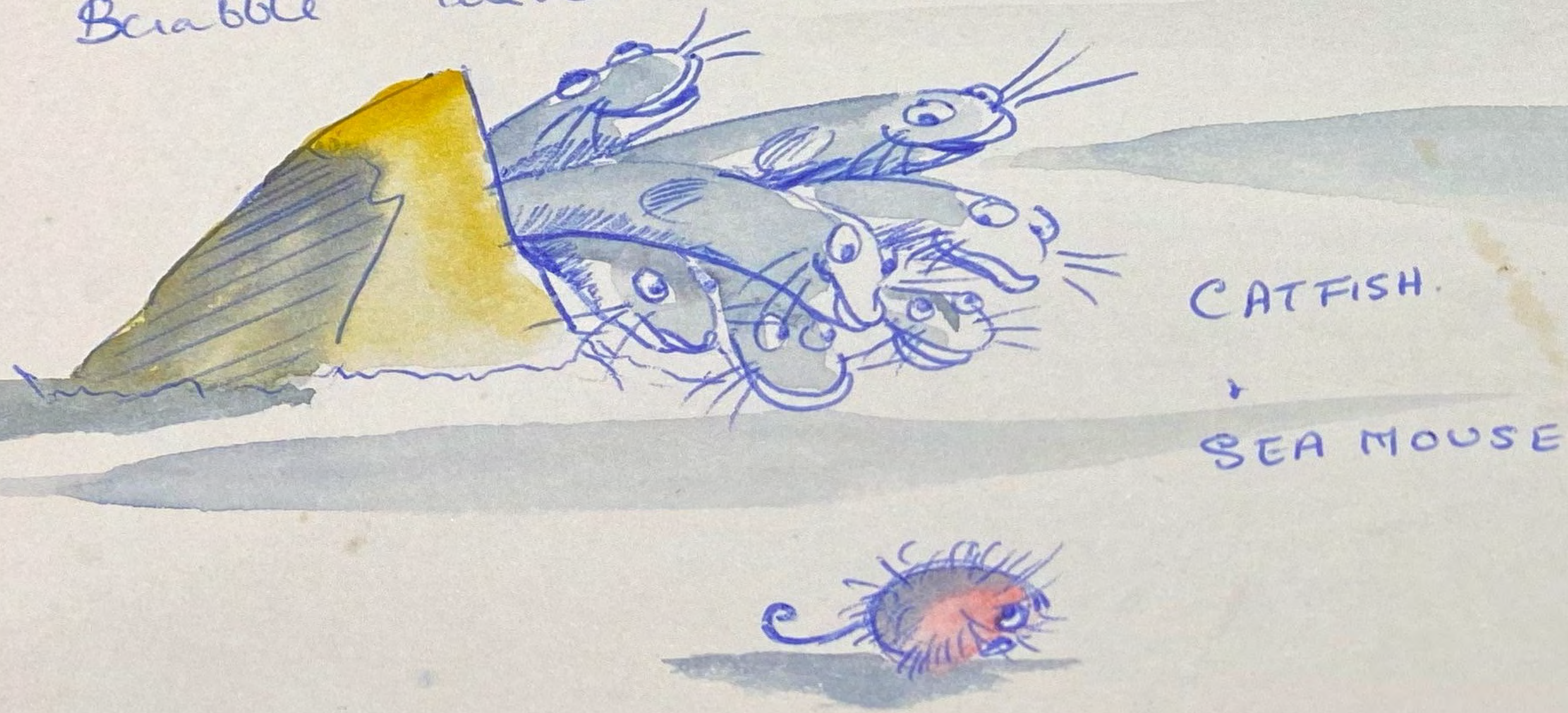
lovely morning but windy. Camp fairly full but not overcrowded. Explored N. facing beach - rock pools, islands, sand, & S beach facing lagoon. Found a wind free beach on this & launched canoe quite choppy. Sailing dinghies. view over to Potheneut. Back to lunch. Veal & beans & macaroni & grapes & Vouvray & sleep & then explored rock pools, Shrimps & shells. Cold collation ^{incl. oysters} in evening & early night. Played boules along the beach to buy at the shop. Visited Cancale & Point de Quouin in p.m. while children on the beach. Saw Oyster beds & oyster women. Bought oysters for John.

SUNDAY. 30. 8. 64.

lovely morning. Wind dropped. Very hot. Breakfast outside. Then down to beach & launched canoe. Swam, played on beach & looked at rock pools & shells. John painted. Michael paddled in little pool full of sticklebacks. Came back & changed, then all went in to Cancale for lunch in restaurant Cancais. Reminded us of the one in Camerick. Full. Menu. langoustines with Poyouaise. Omelette - ham & mushroom. Fruit. Coupe Fromboses (Vicky) Pêche Nelson (Alison) Fées. Muscadier Anjou Rose.

Back to spend afternoon on beach
climbing rocks + island + looking
in rock pool. Identified many
species of seaweed, sand gobies,
stricklebacks, crabs, shrimps, anemones,
limpets, barnacles, hermit crabs, periwinkles.
Sampshire growing on drifts, sea campion
lichens + gorse.

Had early cold supper of Pate Breton,
salad + peaches + then played
Bicrabble until midnight.





MONDAY. 31. 8. 64.

After breakfast left kids on beach. Billie, Jill, John, Richard drove round to Rotherent. Bought some fish. Visited carved rocks of Rotherent. Pivatoens of the 18th broke up at the time of the revolution. They & their demise when they were eaten by sea monsters one carved in the granite rock by an old hermit cave. looked at expensive pottery. Back to a lunch of fried sardines, potatoes, tomato salad & artichokes with Blanc de Blanc. Vin. Afternoon spent on the two beaches & exhaustive study of rock



poole. Found. 2 types sea anemone, shrimps, spider crab, sand goby, blennip (big).
 crab which ate one of our ticklebacks, hermit crabs. Pate, potatoe salad. Fine on the
 headland. Sand castle on the S. beach.

TUESDAY. 1.9.64

Sunny but still strong E. Wind. Drove to see aquarium at Ploemeur. Sea anemones
 Crayfish + Lobsters. Loaming eel fish, gurnards, skate, sea horses, conger eels, plaice, sole,
 dogfish, shell cases + corals. Drove on to S. Malo, walk round ramparts, overlooking
 sea on 3 sides. lunch on ramparts at a little umbrella shaded cafe. Mackerel.
 Moules manniere, Clup, chips, Ice cream. NO CREPES, Cider bon bouche.

Drove on via. St. Servan - attractive little port. Mont Carrot - view of the Rance river valley & suspension bridge. & then to Dinan. Equestrian statue of du Guesclin in the main square. walked around the old town. English garden. Cathedral. Crepes & bon bouche cidre at a creperie. - sweets in the shapes of mushrooms hazel nuts & acorns. Manufacture of antique furniture rather good wheel motives. Back to car & to camp. Canoe along beach to E. end. - quite big waves & hard work. swim in the sunset then paddled back to Alison. Supper. Pate. grapes & cakes. Early night.

Cauldron dogs. creperie etc in courtyard.

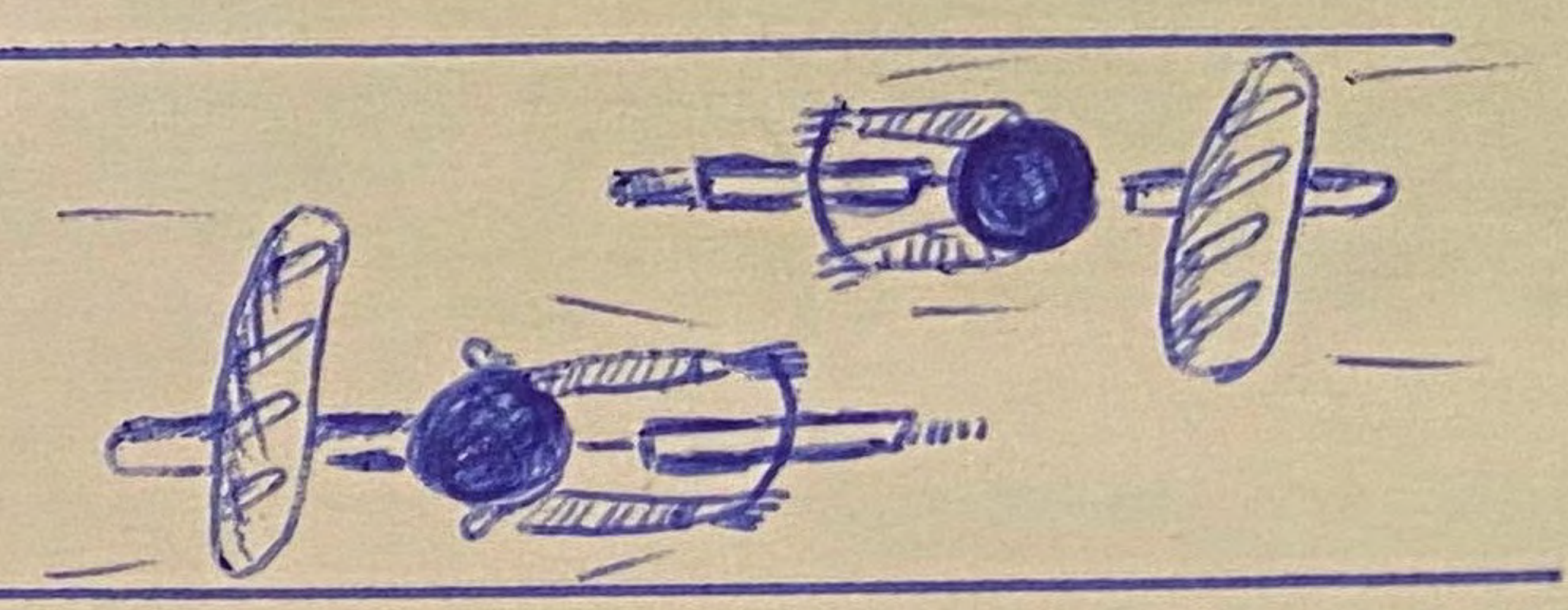

SATURDAY. 5th. Sept.

Hot & sunny & still until late afternoon

Auto Pemos Guinec to get fish (whiting) shrimps & mussels. Fruit. (Michael got stung ~~with~~ by a wasp & had it rubbed with garlic.) Back in the van to Creve Blanche. over loudspeakers. Procession - followed it down to church's calvary, fountain. Church.

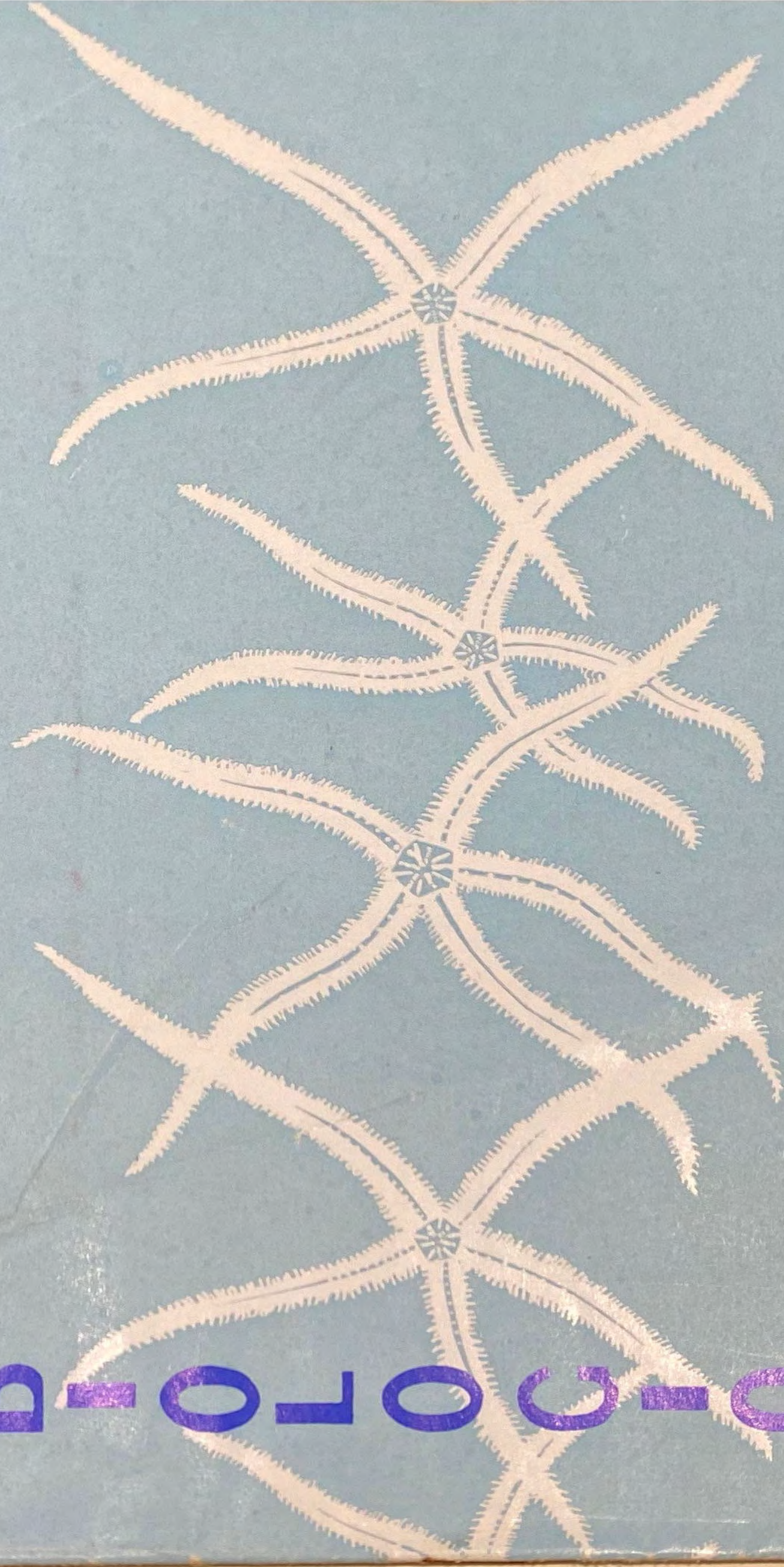
had a remarkable single spine. Fine porch. Salus' Fountains fed by a spring

fdder.



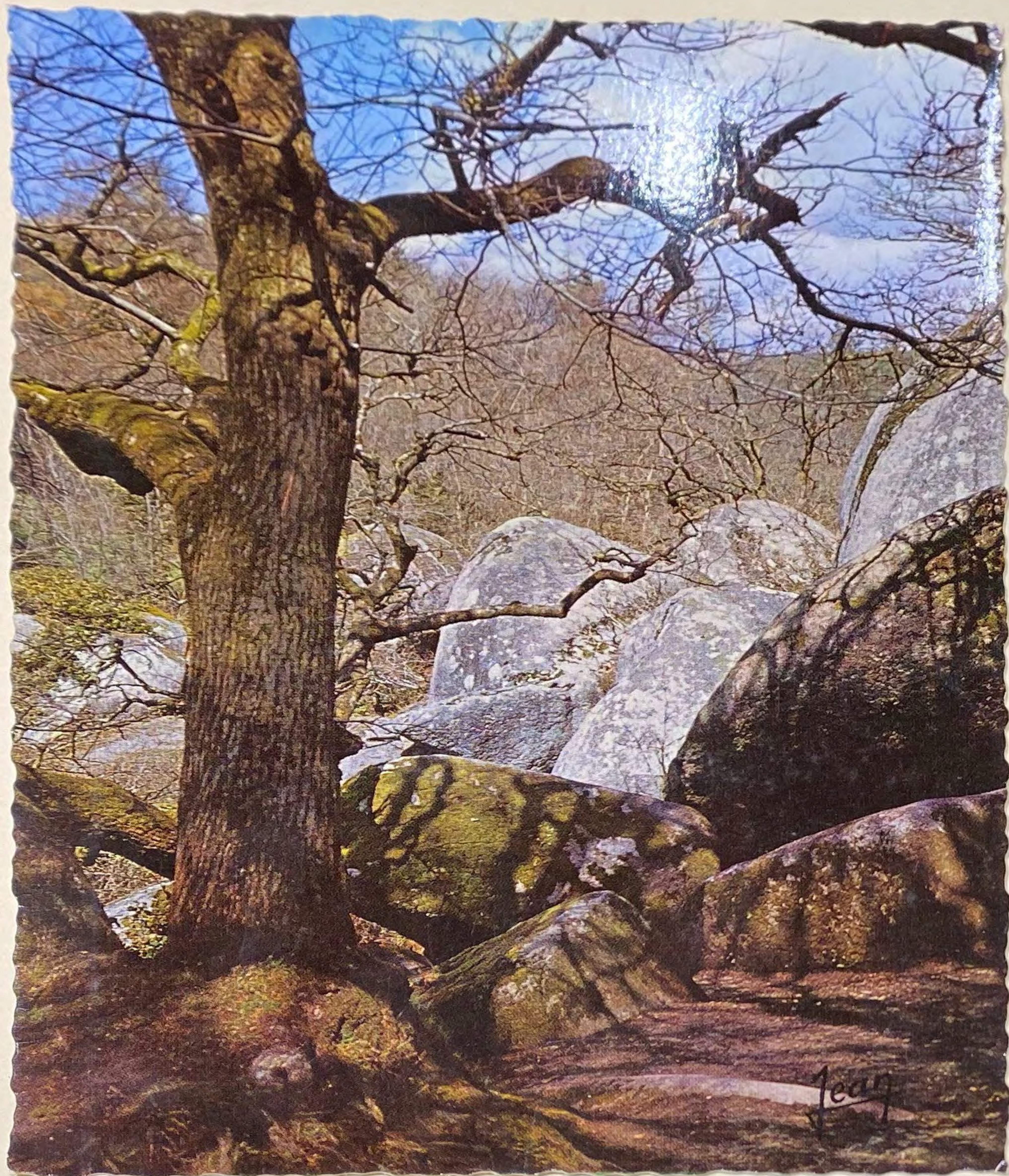

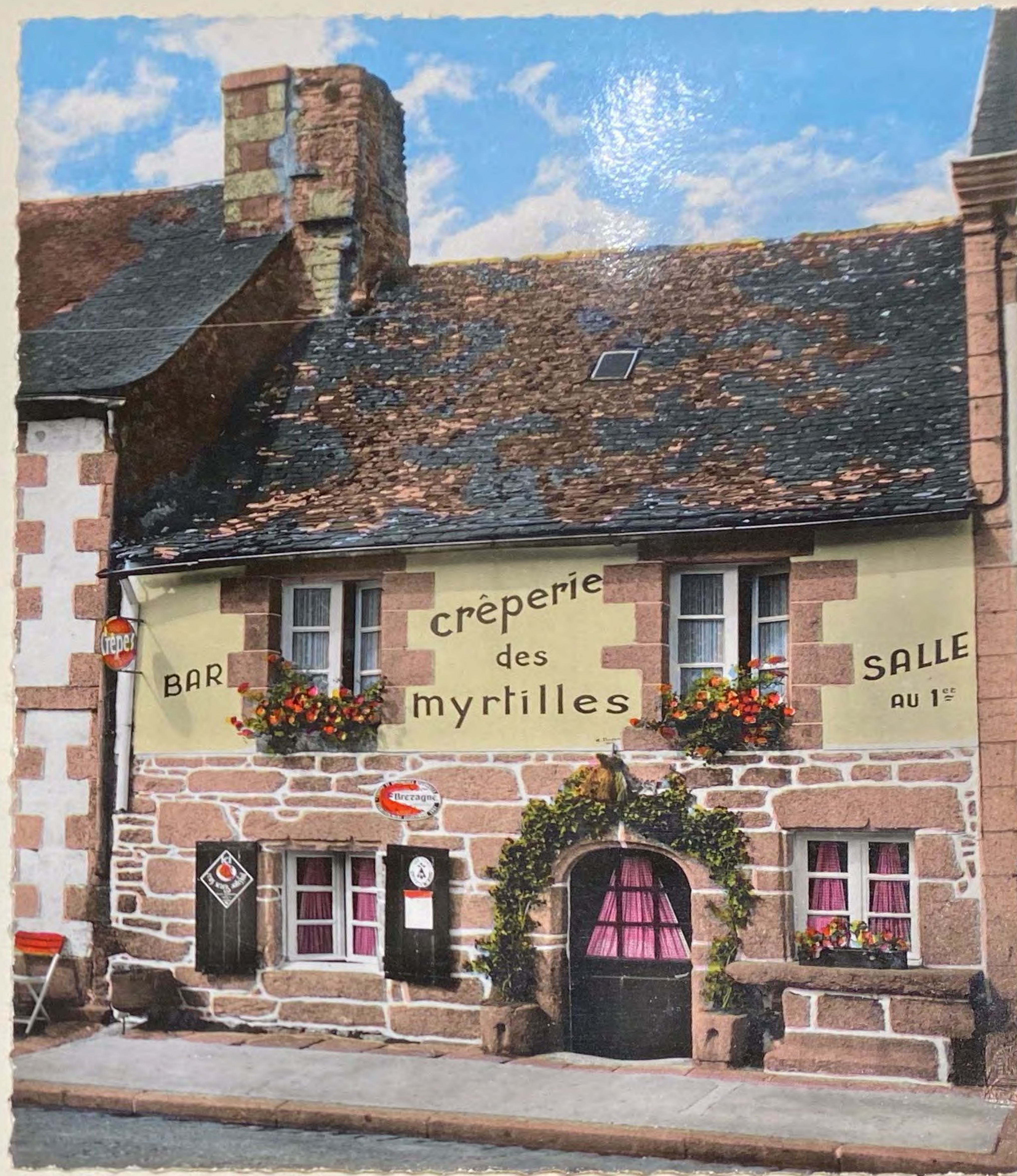

WEDNESDAY. 9th. Sept. Seamist. Fine but dull.

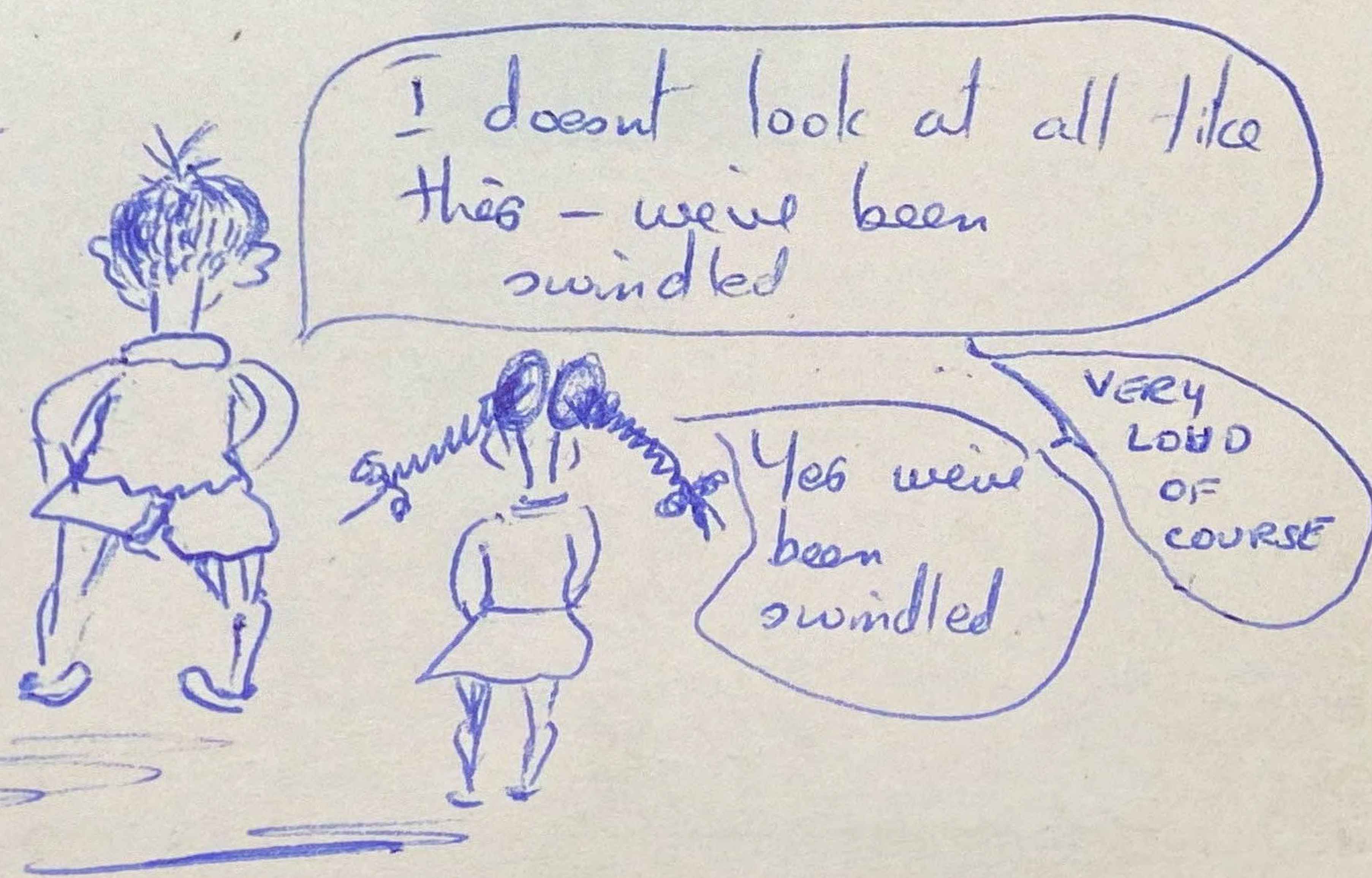
Glad to leave campsite but didn't get away until 11 am. hourly drive via

WHAT IS THIS.?

FRANCOIS II - Sovereign Duke of Brittany.
d. 1489.

ANNE DE BRETAGNE m. MAXIMILIAN. (poor church.)
died age 37.

m. CHARLES VIII
(he was by now 'married' to MARQUERITE OF AUSTRIA, daughter of MAXIMILIAN both 'marriages' were dissolved to allow the 2 bridegrooms to remarry.)

LOUIS XII King of France
(whose marriage to the invalid daughter of Louis XI)

She lost 4 children
Remained sovereign of her duchy.
when CHARLES VIII died at Amboise. (bashed his head on a door lintel. !!!)
had to marry 7 yrs later.

CLAUDE married FRANCIS ANGOULEME who became ~~Francis I~~ **FRANCOIS I** when.

(Louis XII who had remarried MARY OF ENGLAND daughter of HENRY VIII)
He persuaded CLAUDE to cede the duchy of Brittany to the Dauphin & in 1532. the Duchy, the Crown were united.

NASTY MESS → WHERE JILL ATTEMPTED A ROBBERY.

Green wood pecker. Crested wren. Tits. Goldfinches.

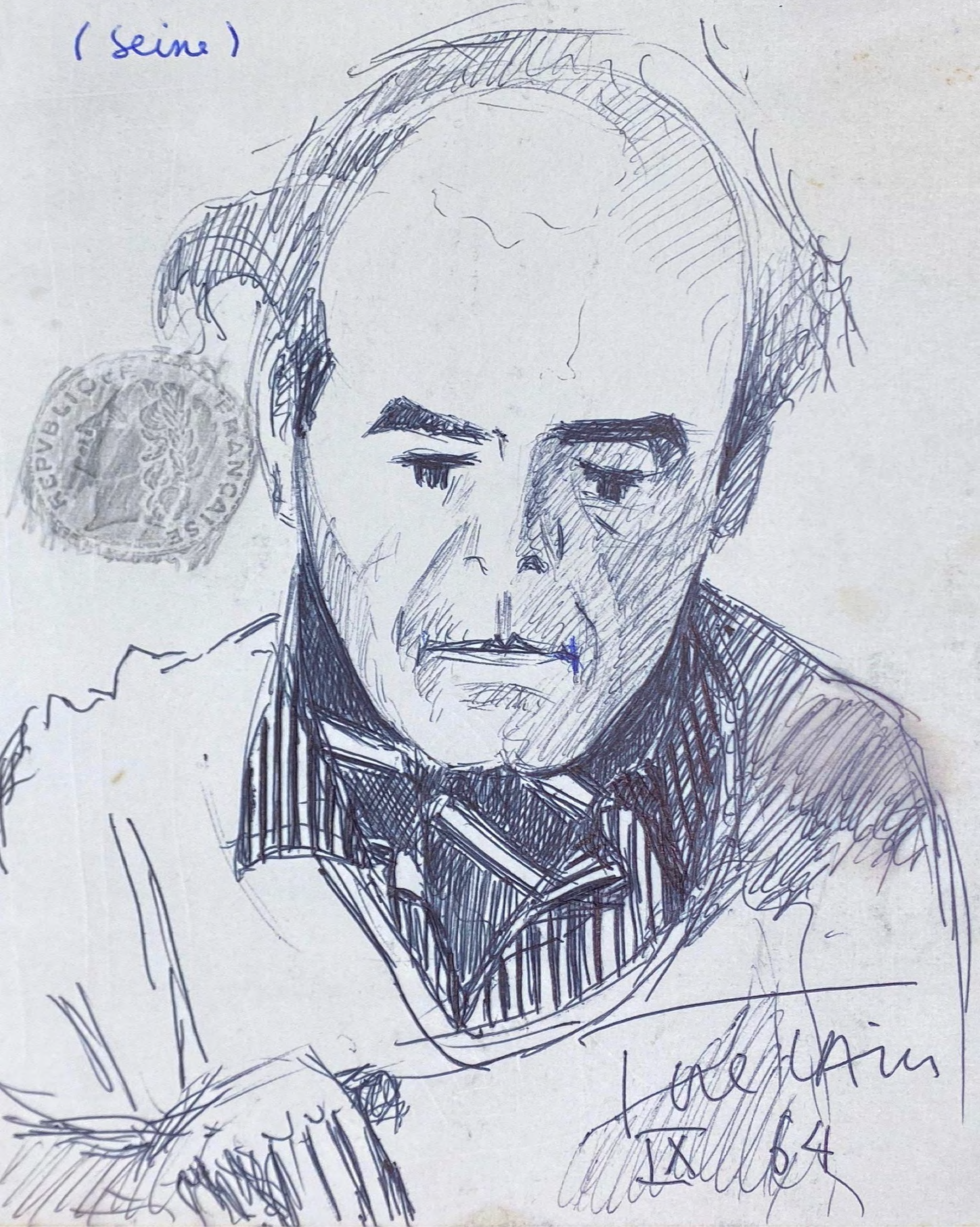
Friday. Sept. 11th.

Dull again with heavy sea mist, turning to rain. But cleared to sunshine, & we were followed by personal

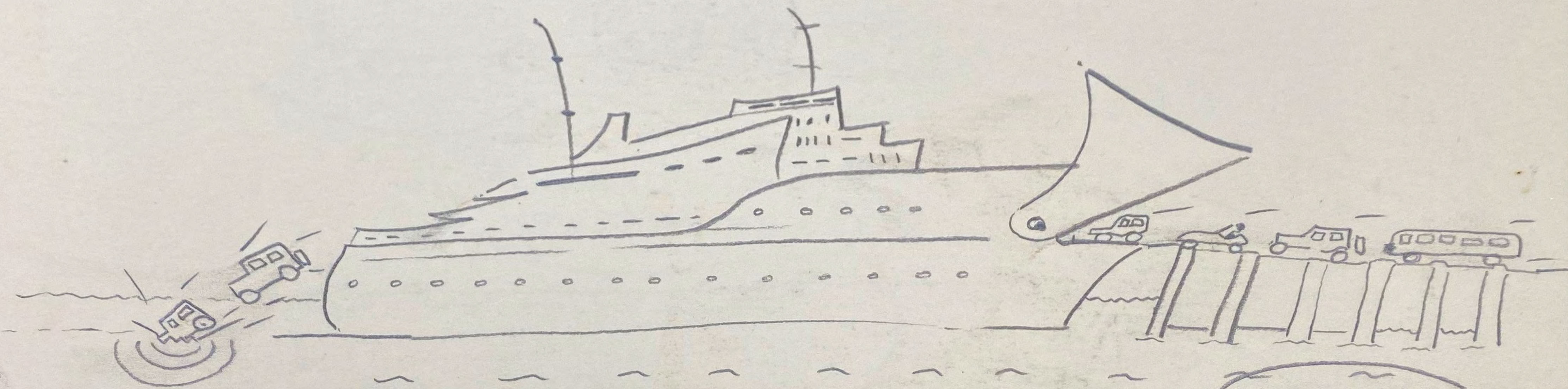
rays of sunshine all the way to Amintin.

 depicting life of St Rouan.



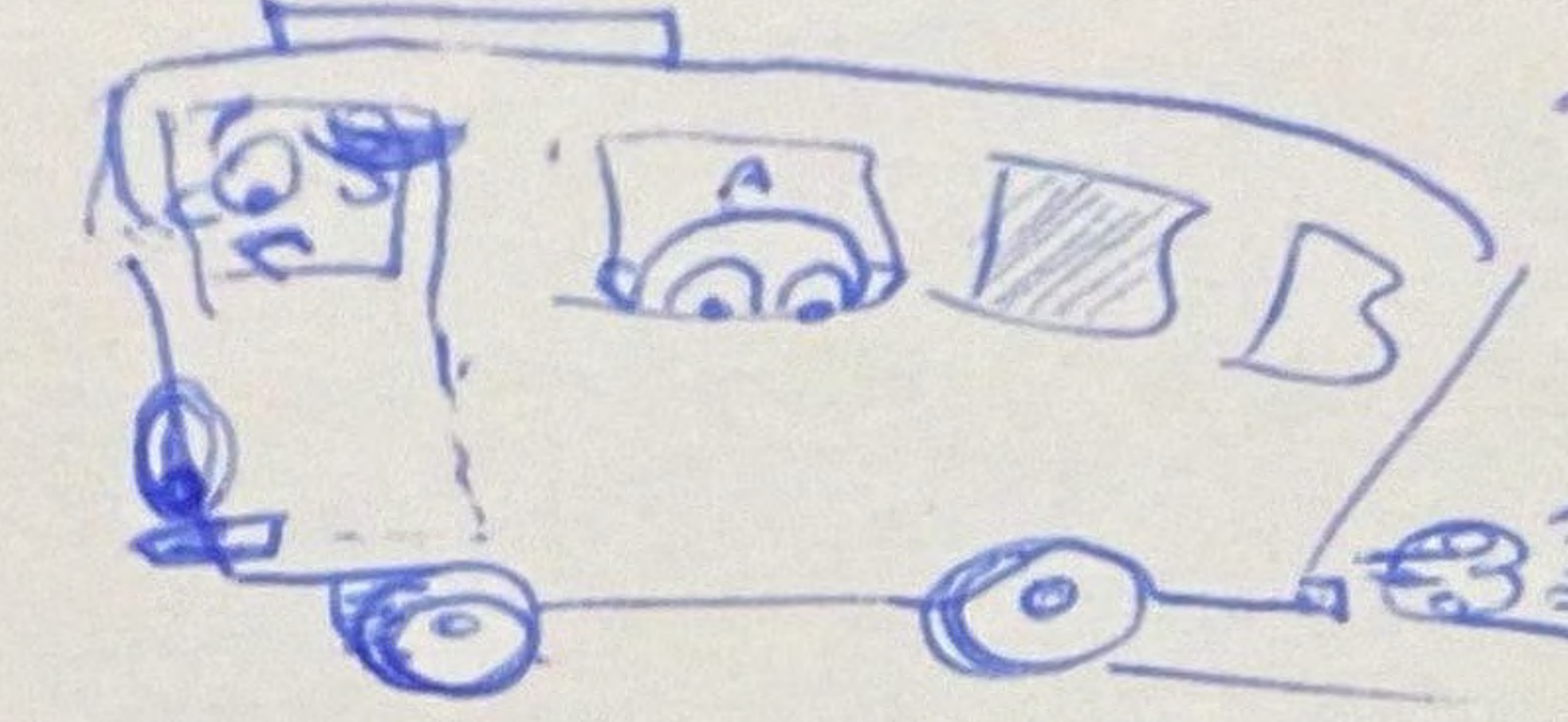
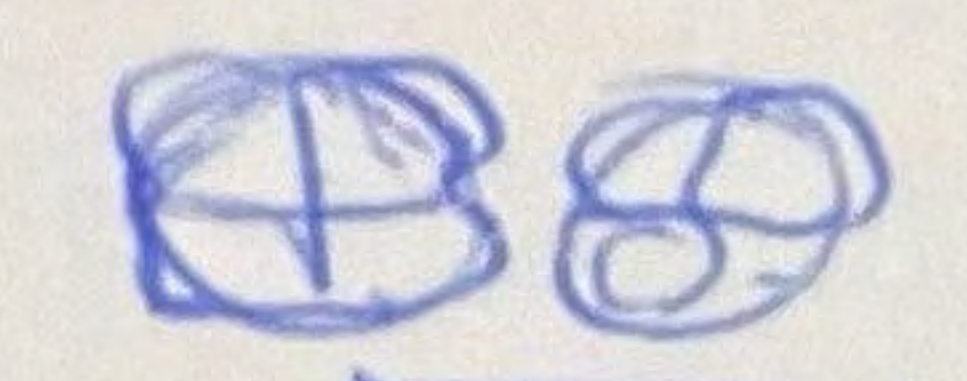
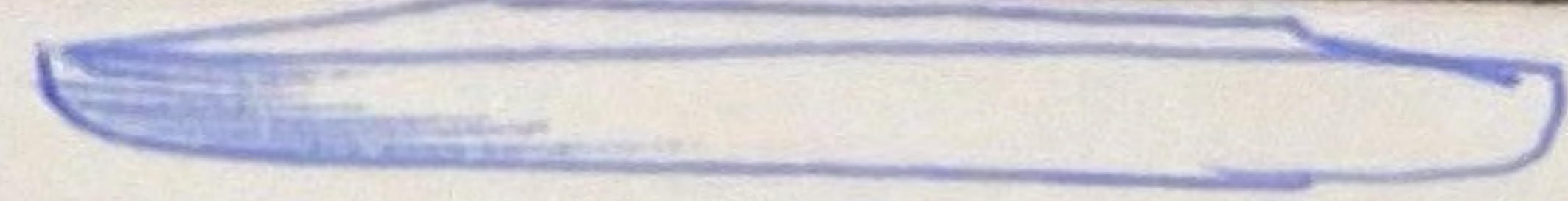
