August 24th 1967.

Thurs. Awoke at 5.30. Foggy morning with promise of sunshine which never materialised - in fact it got thicker & thicker. Walt feeling deserted, wanted tel. nos. of Fire, Police Ambulance etc. (S.W.E.B. Dr. Cairney + Dr. Brownridge). Set off 7.30 (too late) - back for Michael's mac, off again. John in frenzy because late. Drove like a maniac down to Southampton. Traffic bad. Arrived 10.10. nearly the last on board. Viking I. Saw new Viking IV alongside. Saw same Dr Lloyd from B'ham. That we were lost fine. Two hovercraft in docks. Crossed channel in thick fog. Drinks in cafeteria at 11, followed by reading, then brandy + ginger in bar, + fish + chips for lunch. Slept a bit in afternoon. Arrived Cherbourg 1/2 hr late. First impressions of France hampered by petty officialdom of customs officer who seemed to think we were smuggling in canoe-fuls of Gin. Dull drive through Cherbourg peninsula. Shopped at Coutances. Arrived la Cuminerais 8.30 pm. Camp crowded but possible. Put up tent + had supper in camp restaurant. Dishes: morineries + caudites. Huge kebabs of heart, liver, black pudding, mushrooms, onion etc. Cheese, coffee etc.

Frid. Campsite + beach as good as we remembered them
Day dull but warm. Children spent day on beach while
we canoed round bay. Tried to land at larger island but
couldn't - went to other end of beach which was rocky
with lovely sand, + picked up shells. Lunch of pâté from
Camp Butcher's boy.

In afternoon got out other canoe + went over to other
island, landed + walked up to top. Covered with bones
including a ? human finger. Evidence of seagulls nesting.
dog-fish egg, cases etc. Steps up side. Bridge across gulf.
John lost way on top, nearly drowned there. Then
canoed round point to sandy cove, + back to beach where
we spent afternoon looking at rock pools.
Supper cooked in camp. Artichokes with French dressing.
Veal chops.
Potatoes. Petit Pois
Tomato Salad. Grapes + Borgewil
(Touaine wine)

Sat.
Hot morning, after rising mist.
Nothing to beach. Rest of us into Cancale. Looked round shops
+ harbor. Bought Alison a swimming costume as she had
forgotten hers. Quayside shops full of pottery, oysters,
oyster plates, dolls etc. Beautiful harvest loaf like a wheatsheaf.
Back to camp - lunch of delicious pâté in little pottery dish. Pars.
Muscadet, Oysters, Salad marse.

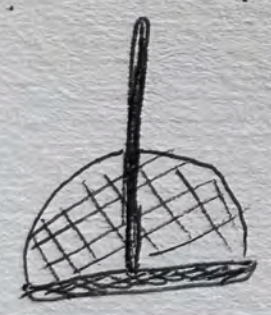

Sunday August 27th Very hot morning - Almost too hot to be out by
breakfast time. Covered ourselves in Ambre Solaire.
Got up late, canoed along beach with Michael, had a
swim (even me). Lay on beach, Drink + ices in beach
cafe on way back. ~~Went~~ Collected children + drove
into Rottembourg. Tried to get crepes but creperie closed. Bought
net for sand fishing. Drove back along coast towards
Cancale to beach creperie. Not very good. Moutles merisiers
for us + steak + chips for Michy. Followed by crepes (not v. good one)
Rum, sugar, butter. Lots of cider.
Back to camp + slept + read until 4.0 pm. Then to beach
to look at rock pools. Caught a blennie + medusa, type
jelly-fish + a larger fish, a sort of gurnard? + lots of shrimps.
Beach very crowded with Sunday crowds. Coloured umbrellas.
Rubber canoes, snorkels.

Early supper of Soup + Garlic Sausage - To bed + read.

Monday 28.8.67 Up lake, lazy mooching around until about 11.0 when
we went in to Rottembourg. Had a look at pottery
+ aquarium, Seahorse caught by clam. Dogfish lost its
spots. Larger eel lost bit of tail. Lobsters with elastic bands

round their class. Then to excellent lunch in Hotel du Centre. Meal for 9Fr.

Langoustines. Melon.
Tomato Salad, Jambon beurre.
Michael - Sole & chips,
us - Pintadeau (? Guinea Fowl) & chips
Ices (not on menu), Fruit.

Sizzled in Sun.

Back to camp, then John & I canoed round into Rothement harbour with big net & caught some shrimps, crabs, a small squid & a couple of little flat fish. Professional shrimpper also hit.

Transported catch in a bucket back to camp

to show to children.

Cooked supper - Frankfurters & beans. John had tinned tripe (ugh)

Tuesday, 29.8.67

After breakfast Hicky to beach Rest to Rothement to see if fishing ok. Tide too high still coming up. Back to camp. Jill walked round lagoon to Rothement



John on bicycle to paint picture at hamlet of ha Cucinarais (see 2 pages on).
Children built elaborate stonehenge like Temple of Athene. (see over).

Then lunch. After lunch
John & Jill carried canoe to
lagoon & canoed up to top
of lagoon to old jetty
men fishing for oysters.
Kingfisher, black backed gull.

Quite rough so decided not to
take outer passage back to
ha Cucinarais. - school of
fish leaping in front of
us. - Back to camp.
walked up island on
zoological & botanical expedition
ident. had lichens etc.

Colours beautiful - clear views
later down to see Temple
sand castle & then all went
fishing to Rotheneuf.

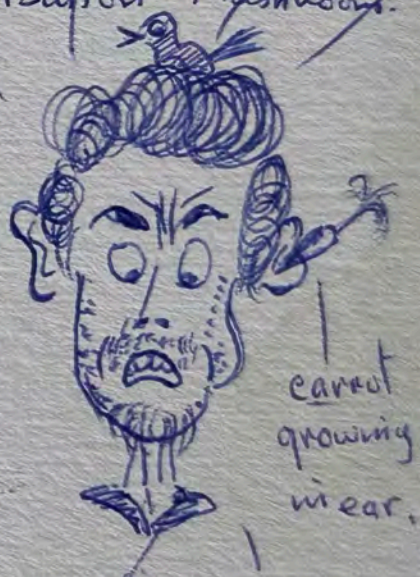


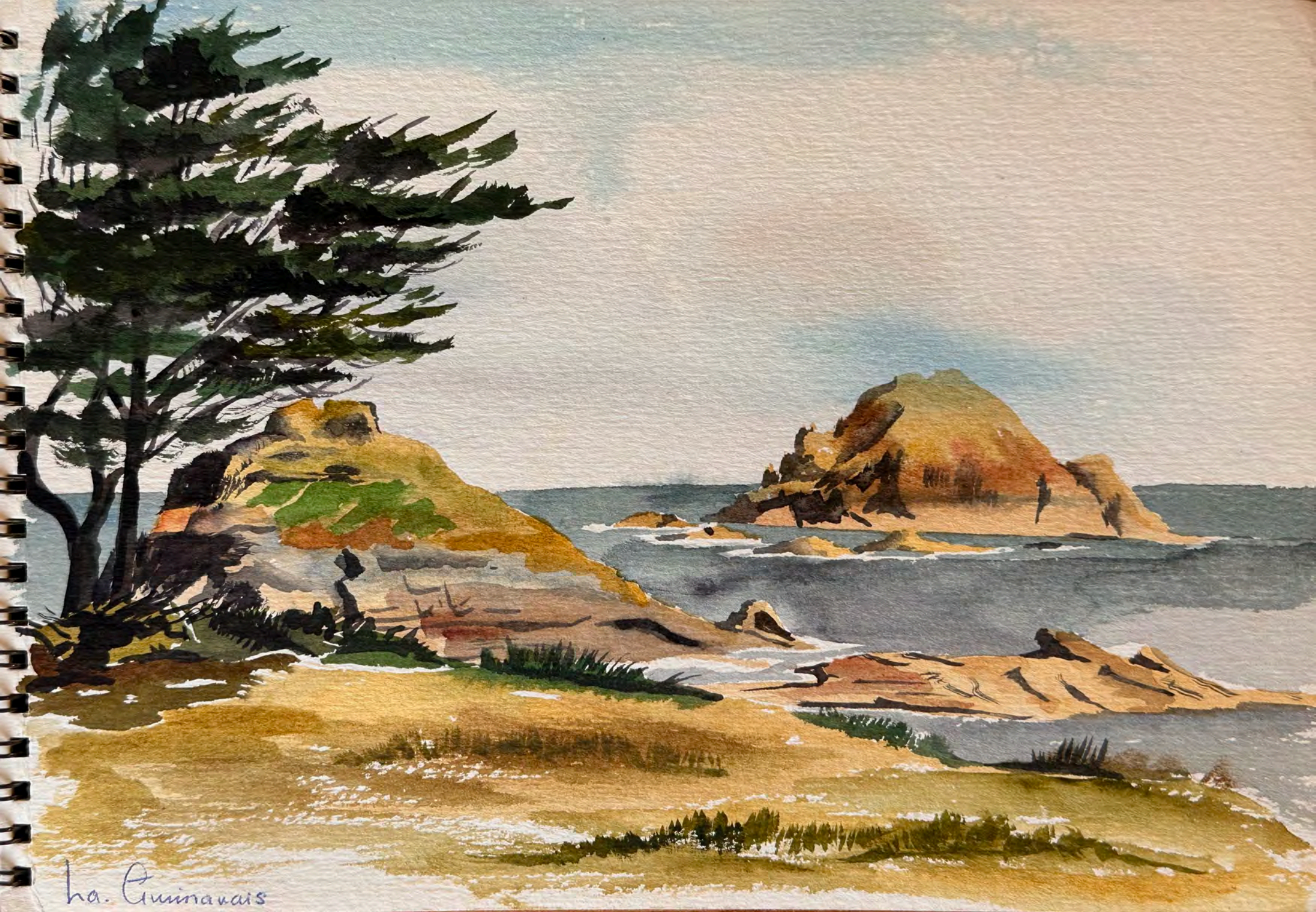
At Restaurant du Centre. Rotheneuf. Monday.

Canoeed back & forth with makeshift paddle with no footrests or backrests - $\frac{1}{2}$ hour fish caught, small sole, flatfish, squid which changed colours & shrimps - Micky wanted to keep to eat. Then all back to camp & changed - Michael to bed - then all out to Concale to restaurant (Michelin ~~2~~³) but Surcouf menu looked poor. & so to Restaurant Cancalais where John had two hors d'oeuvres. langoustines & Moules Farcies (Alison. Moules Manieres) Jill. (Moules Farcies) Micky. langoustines. Then. John & Micky. Steaks & Jill. Alison Veal & Buffon Mushrooms. Coffee. & Micky had Coupe Framboises. Thinking it was Coupe Fraise! Staggered back to camp.

Wednesday. 30.8.67.

Another lovely day. Decamped slowly & didn't leave until 11.30 am. Inland from la Cuminerais. to Dol. - past the prehistoric Tilot Dol. - Dol beflagged as usual. Charentais white cattle - sweetcorn. pumpkins. in fields lots of flowers on roadside houses. Fougeres. stopped at chateau fort & walked round outside of walls magnificent medieval fortress with moat, own watermill & beflagged with old flags. On through haval - unremarkable & stopped for lunch in small lane off sideroad. man spraying field with what?



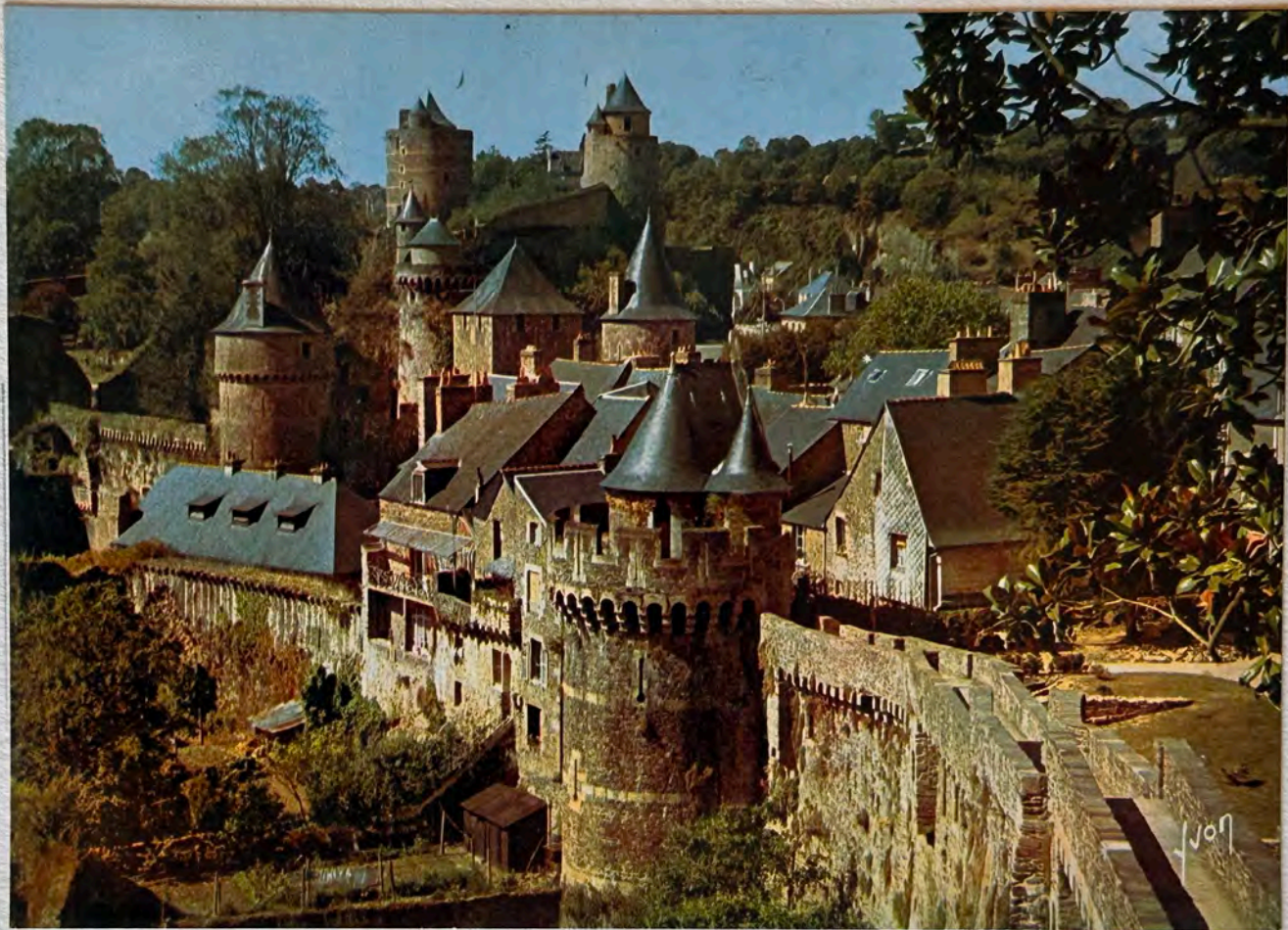

Thursday. 31. 8. 67. lovely morning. - misty becoming sunny. loaded canoes & off to Villandry by part of the routes des Pommiers. Caves of hoire wines. Gardens at Villandry magnificent - Picture of hanging head decapitated in the gallery. French gardens restored in 19th in style of 16th. - see p. 60. - water gardens canal, topiary & vegetable gardens - even the paths were patterned. Then across country to Antannes & left bicycle on the Indre by a mill at a niveronne camp. Drive up to

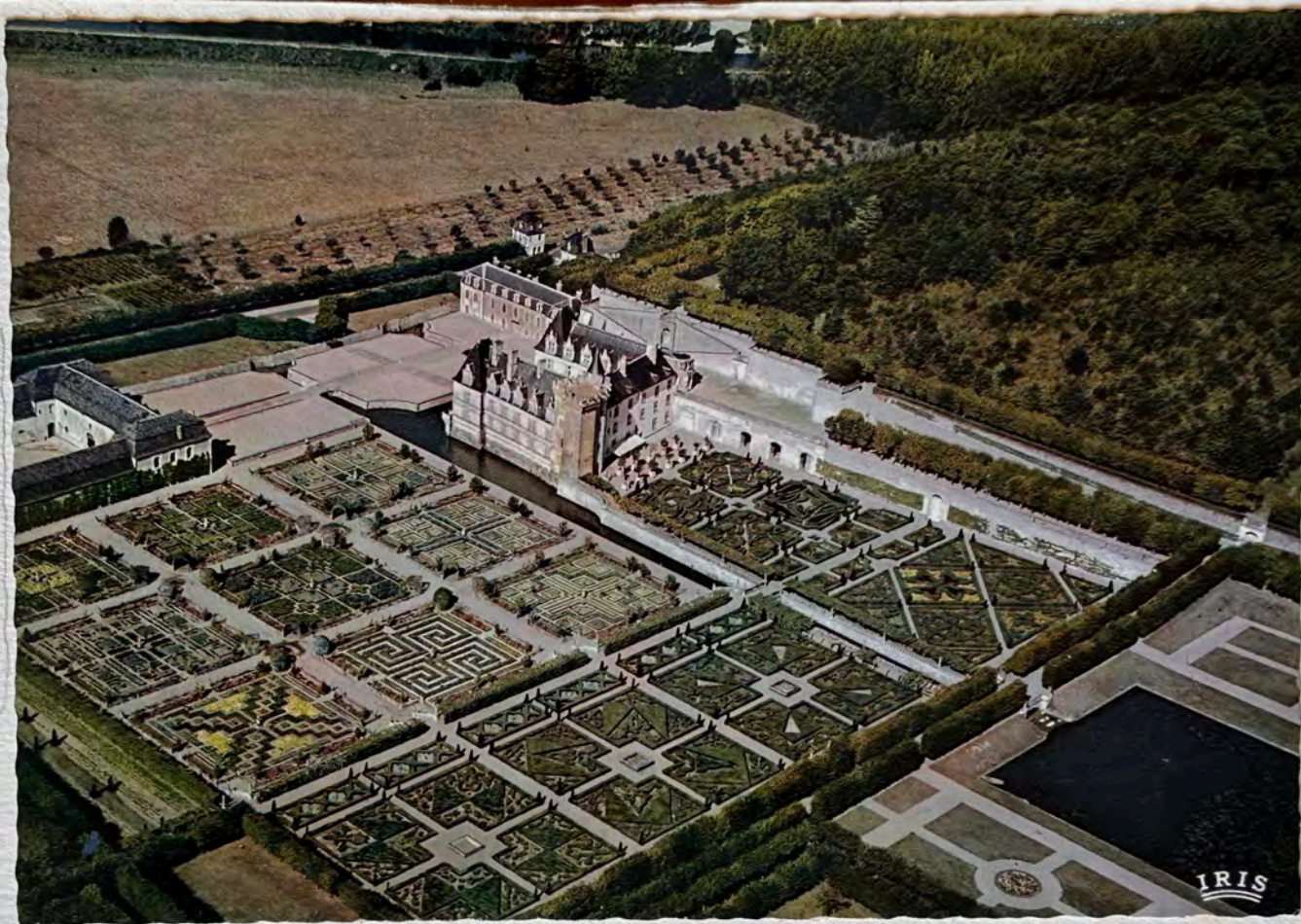

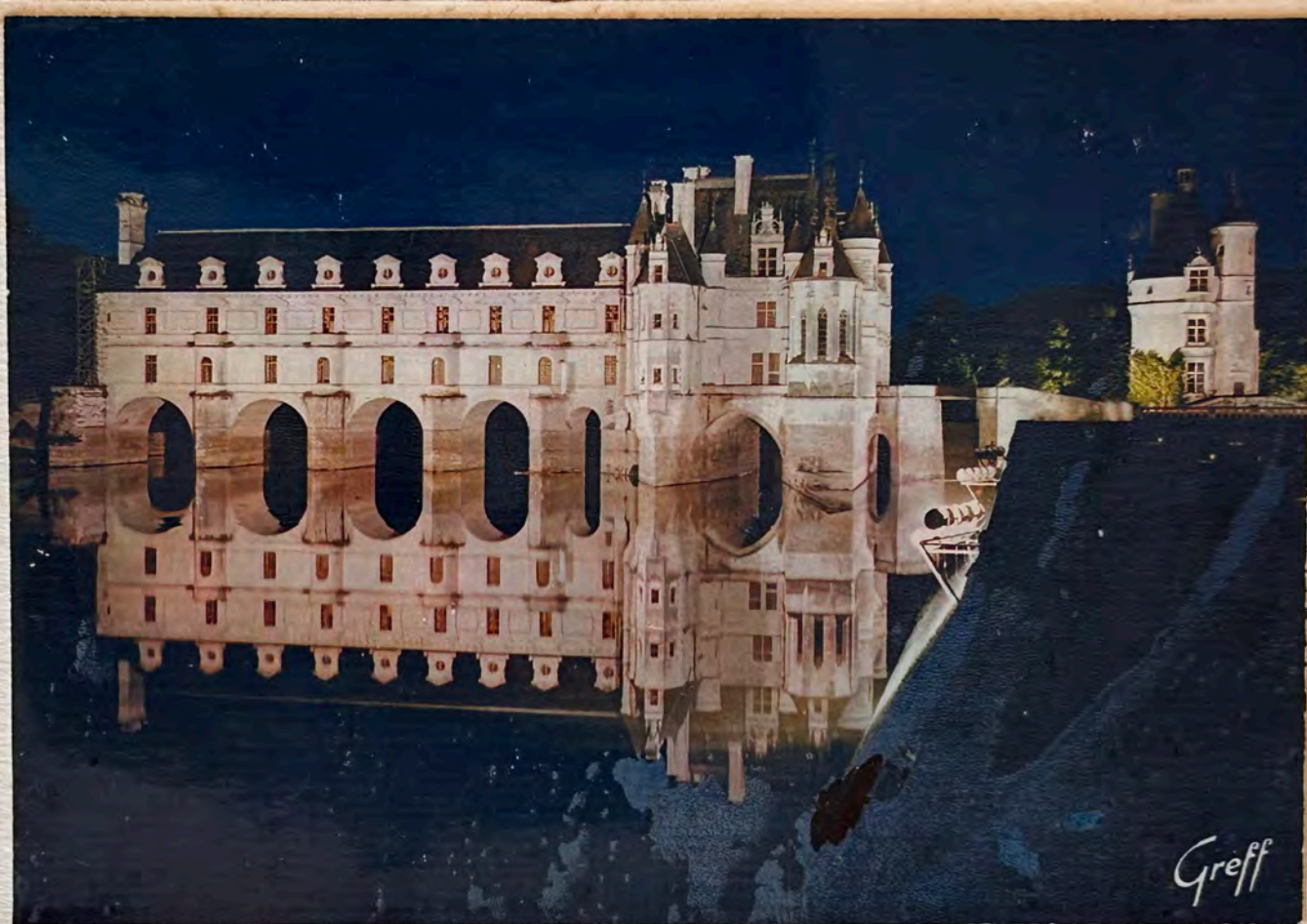
Montbazou past a Poudrenie (what is this? headquarters of SITERSH. - surrounded by double wire fence etc. - up to place in Montbazou where a busload of camping Europe from Brunley! Bought lunch launched canoes + so downstream. - soon came to first hazard - a weir - portage + lunch soon after this at fishing station on river bank in the middle of poplars. Very hot. After lunch chopped down to another weir + mill at Chateau D'Antigny, very soon after this unable to go further - private river - barricade across with more wire - guarded etc - caused back with various horrendous harrying + harrying us. - get back, private property etc

(Henry II gave Chenonceaux to her) Beautiful fireplace, long gallery over river

Left bicycle at campsite about 1/2 mile upstream. Drove up to Fontenay-le-Comte,
left car in ~~campsite~~ ^{place}, canoeed down Cher. Wide river like
the Seine. Slow stream, wind against us. Many weirs, &
locks, had obviously been a working river at one time.
Lunch on river bank, then on down lots of men fishing, some
with 3 rods at once. Arrived campsite about 4. I biked back

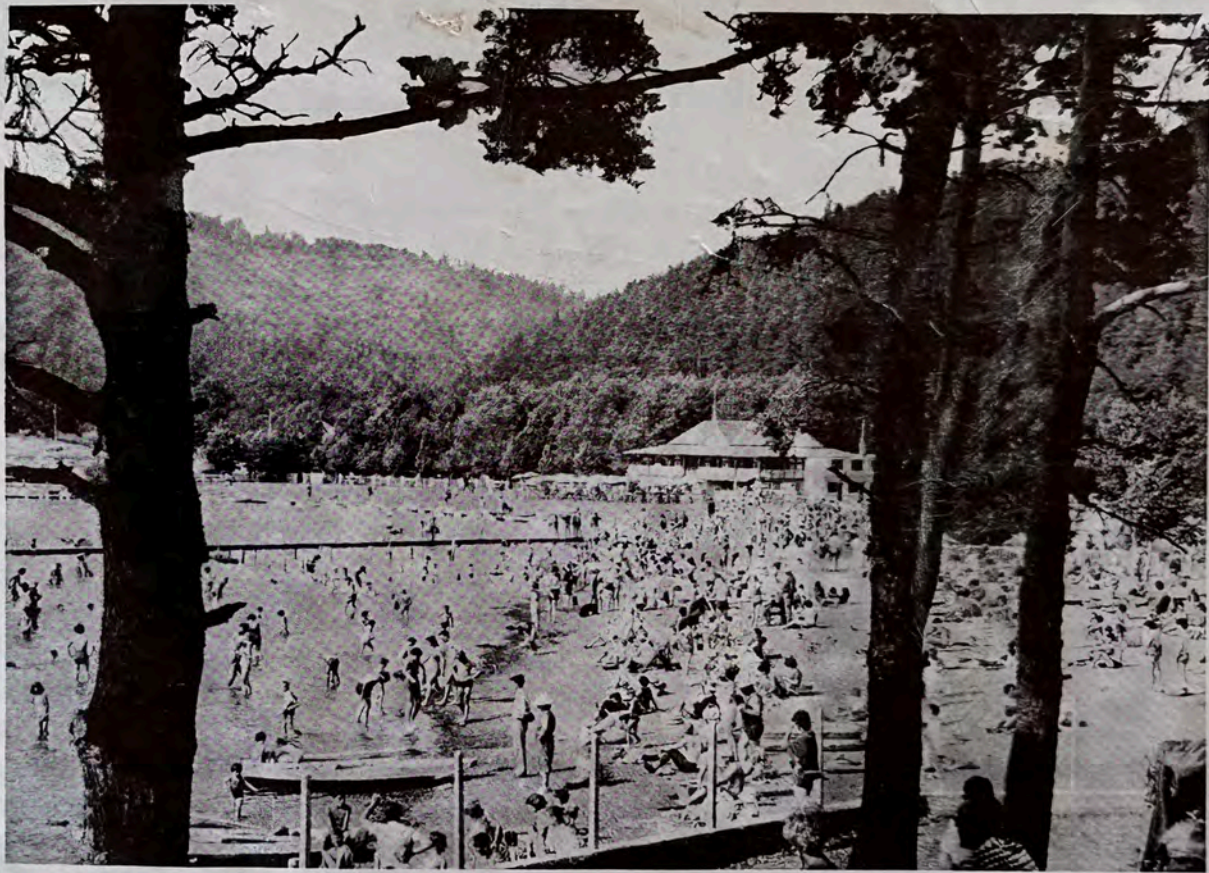

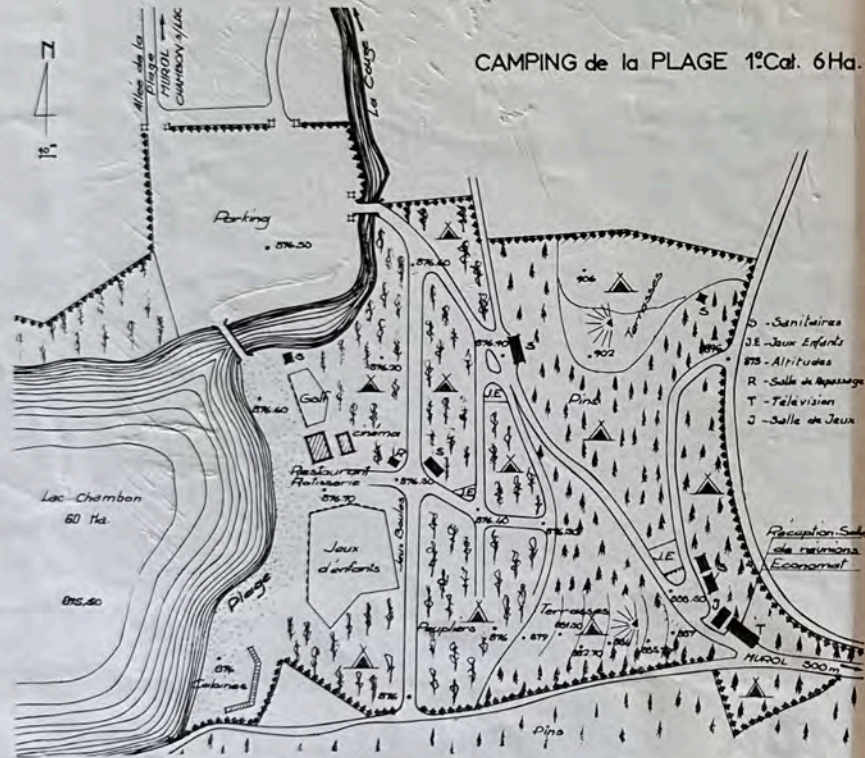


for car while John canoeed down to take picture of Chenonceaux.

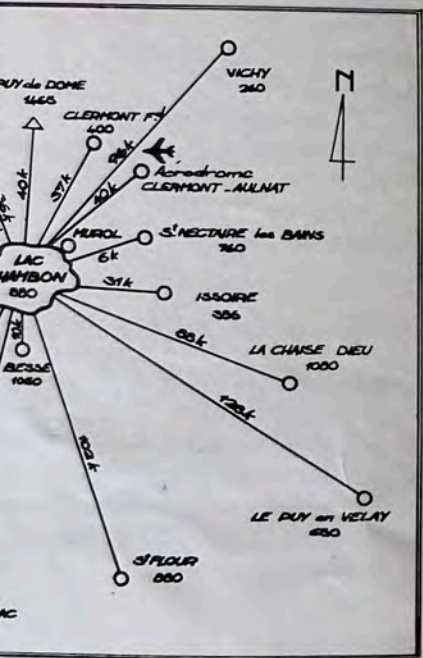
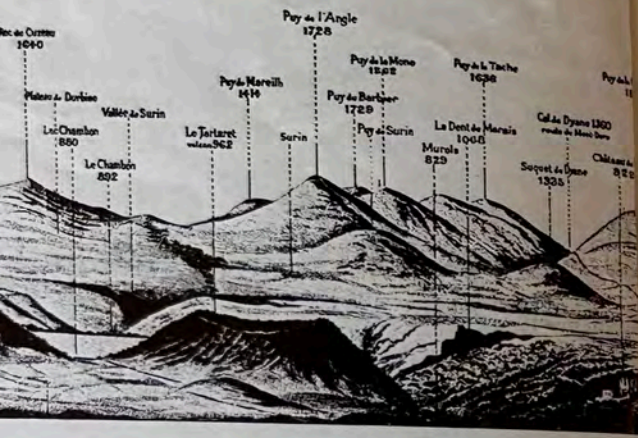

Sat. Sept. 2nd. Michael's birthday, Packed up by 11, then to see chateau of Aray. Small intricate chateau. Renaissance. Magnificent outbuildings, beautiful staircase - Italian style. with arms of François I & Anne de Bretagne. Kitchen with corvings, utensils & well, biscuit moulds, huge fireplace. State rooms hung in red & green with Cordovan leather chairs, 4-poster beds. Notable portraits, tapestries etc.

Then off towards Auvergne, via Saché, mills on the Indre, lodges to small town on other side of river Indre, where we had lunch in a hot cornfield nr. St. Germain. Then on via Châtillon & Bourançais - Chateauroux, then off main road beyond La Châtre & along pretty side road through Boussac, Evaux (a spa) & Port-Caban. Countryside beginning to look mountainous. Charançais white cattle. Views of Puy de Dôme. lovely evening drive through Rochefort Montagne up over mountains of the Mont Dore. Rocks of Turleries & Sanadoire. Over hair-raising pass by lac Guery, & dark for rest of way to Murols. Unimpressive first impression of campsite so back to other end of lake, & back again. Large camp on gravel. Friday. 5th Sept.

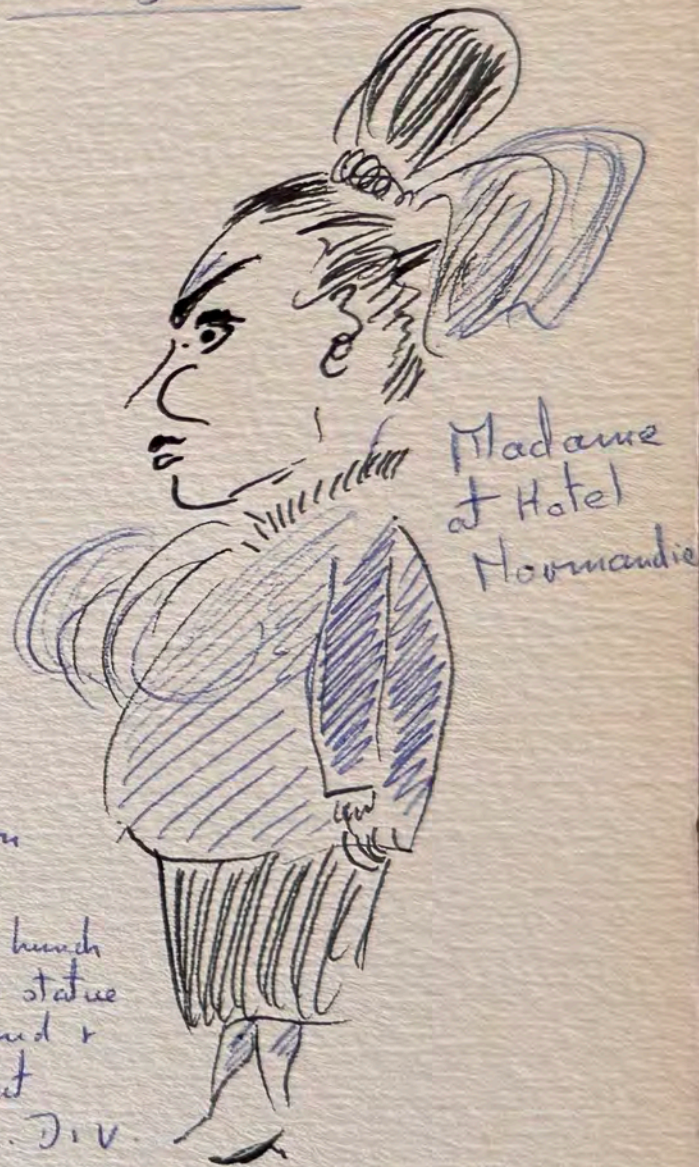
Jill ill. Dr. Sotto Voce. Beautiful morning later cloud. left good weather on way

Thursday. 7.9.67. Drove round Falaise. Birthplace of William the Conqueror. Chateau. Equestrian Statue with statues of forbears below. - swotted up genealogie on way to Bayeux where we saw tapisserie *** + cathedral. Comment in English on the pictures. Tapestry in flowers outside. Beautiful Romanesque nave in cathedral. with varied stone carving. 150 to Cherbourg through heavy showers. lunch in Restaurant in Market Square. Soup. Veal (A+II) Sole + chips (III) Turbot (VII) Moules Marinières (John) Caramel custards. Bought spuds in market + anti-dotes + so to boat arrived last on first, good seats. Fin de vacances.

Picnic lunch before Blois. Vendôme lovely chateau. Epuissey then side road to Ferte Bernard - magnificent cathedral + herd of priests. Circus. Alençon. Sees - cathedral, Argentan + stopped at Falaise 7.30 p.m. at Hotel Normandie. Immediately pounced on by body of children masquerading as waiters + waitresses being supervised by ugly looking madame. Swept up to most expensive rooms in hotel with tapestry + frippery on walls. (madame's influence) changed + down to drinks + supper. Nicky arrived without socks having broken bidette plug + having had a go at the shutters. late but hair brushed. Thyrotoxic hurriedly harassed Monsieur in a frenzy of supervision.

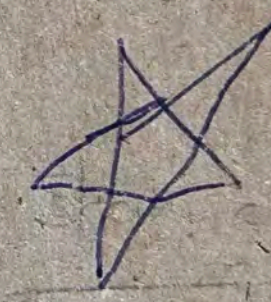
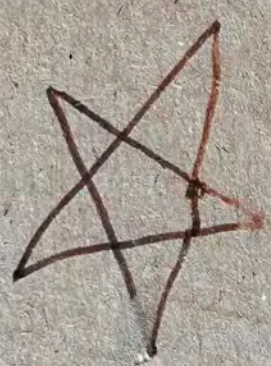
